- Water is extremely important in the Ahrntal Valley.
 Avoid excessive use, wastage and polluting of water and contribute to the global protection of water resources.
- Caring for our towns and villages and the landscape is especially important to us. Avoid making a mess in public places and ensure that waste is only disposed of in the correct receptacles. Do not leave any waste in your surroundings.
- Wherever possible use public transport.
- If you wish to enjoy an active holiday in our region (hiking, cycling, skiing, snowshoeing etc.) take note of the weather forecast, and the avalanche report too in winter, as well as the guidelines on how to behave in the mountains.
